


# Month's Mind Requiem Mass at Our Lady Queen of Peace Cemetery

# **Kidney Stones**

If you have ever had a kidney stone, you know how painful they can be. In recent years, management of kidney stones depends upon individual circumstances. Advances in imaging is making it easier to tell whether a procedure is needed to remove the stone and which procedure will result in the best outcome. Understanding the factors that go into stone formation will help lower the risk of developing new stones.

Kidney stones are made up of crystals formed from minerals in the urine. With adequate fluid intake, the urine is diluted and the crystals either don't form or are passed naturally out of the body. Normal urine also contains substances that inhibit crystal formation. Crystals can form when there is an increase in the amount of minerals in the urine due to dehydration or when the inhibitors don't work properly or are absent. When the crystals accumulate, they anchor to the inner wall of the kidney and grow into a stone. Once dislodged, they pass from the kidney through a tube (ureter) connecting the kidney to the bladder. The stone is eliminated from the body when it passes out of the bladder and through the urethra.

Some kidney stones may pass with little or no pain. However, many cause waves of pain that can occur on the side and back, just below the rib cage and radiate to the lower abdomen and groin. Additional signs and symptoms may include blood in the urine, nausea and vomiting, a persistent urge to urinate, or pain with urination. If an infection is present, some people experience a fever and chills. Seek medical help with any of these symptoms.

Minimizing the pain is usually the first step when a stone is present. Laboratory blood and urine testing will show kidney function and signs of infection. CT scan imaging of the abdomen and pelvis can confirm stone location, size and degree of urinary obstruction. In some cases, shock wave lithotripsy is used to break up the stone into tiny pieces that can be more easily passed. Ureteroscopic stone removal is another procedure used to remove a lodged stone. Percutaneous nephrolithotomy is a minimally invasive surgery performed to remove larger stones.

Keeping your urine dilute by drinking 8 to 12 cups of water daily to increase urine flow is essential for helping pass stones and preventing additional ones from forming. Maintaining a healthy weight and controlling diabetes with portion control and eating minimally processed plant foods is important. Reduce sodium intake and limit animal protein to less than 6 ounces daily.
