### **HOW DO WE PROCLAIM OUR FAITH?**

"And I tell you, everyone who acknowledges Me before others, the Son of Man also will acknowledge before the Angels of God; but whoever denies Me before others will be denied before the Angels of God." Luke 12:8-9

In our daily life, God has given us plenty of opportunities to acknowledge our faith in Christ. Our proclamation can

be made by our actions, our words, our reactions in trying situations, and our thoughts and attitudes.

Today the Lord is calling us to take a moment to think and reflect on how we proclaim Jesus in any given situation. Do we truly reflect the light that God has bestowed within us or do we let it go by?

For example, in a situation where we have an acquaintance who is in despair and has lost hope in life, what is our first instinct?

- Do we attempt to help?
- If we attempt to help, do we have enough strength to proclaim hope in Jesus or are we comfortable directing them only towards a secular solution?

Through this scripture verse, we may ask ourselves:

- Are we proud and thankful for our faith in Christ?
- Do we shy away from acknowledging Christ as our Savior?

Let us pray to the Lord today to give us the grace to proclaim Jesus' name, a name given for the salvation of humankind, boldly to everyone around us. God Bless.

### MEDITATION: FOR BEST RESULTS, GET ON THE FLOOR

Meditation is a practice that can help us focus our full attention on the present moment. Meditation is not prayer. Nor is it contemplation or positive thinking. In fact, meditation has no content at all. Meditation of this sort is called mindfulness.

When we meditate mindfully, there's nothing we're supposed to be thinking about. Instead, we focus our attention on the present moment. To do that, we simply pay attention to our breathing – our inhaling and exhaling. This can help us live in the here and now, capturing the moment. So often, habit and our pace of living deaden us to the here and now. Our time slips right by us, under our very noses.



In particular, we're sometimes held captive by thoughts armed with a will of their own. Run riot, our stream of consciousness can rob us of inner peace and quiet. Meditation helps to check this flow. But we've got to practice it.

The best way to practice mindfulness is to sit on the floor or in a chair in an erect posture. Put all thoughts out of your mind. Just concentrate on your breathing – in and out. Take note of the course of your thoughts. If they become like water gushing from an open hydrant, bring your attention back to your breathing. This will keep you in the moment. There's no goal to this kind of meditation. We're not striving for any deep insight. It's simply a time to quiet the mind and live in the present. Try it for five minutes.

Mindfulness meditation has big benefits: it helps control thoughts, increases energy, reduces stress, and give us a sense of calm, peace, and balance. A good book on the general subject is the bestseller by Jon Kabat-Zinn, Wherever You Go, There You Are: Mindfulness Meditation in Everyday Life. And for a Catholic perspective on mindfulness, read Thomas Keating's Open Mind, Open Heart, one of many books he's written on what he calls "Centering Prayer." -Deacon Ken Vianale (kvianale@holyspiritlantana.com)

### Saint of the Week

Blessed Miguel Agustín Pro (1891-1927) November 23


Graham Greene's classic The Power and the Glory immortalized Mexico's persecuted Church of the 1920s. But photographs of Father Pro—arms outstretched to image Christ Crucified, kneeling in prayer before the firing squad, crumpled dead on the ground—vividly, visually remind us that not long ago, not far away, the faith we take for granted cost everything! Born to a mining family, Miguel became a Jesuit and was sent to study Catholic labor movements in Belgium in preparation for evangelizing Mexico's workers. But he returned to find a Mexico determined to annihilate Catholicism, and, like priests before him during Roman persecutions, England's Reformation, and in China today, ministered secretly to an "underground Church" until apprehended and sentenced to the firing squad. In his final moments, Father Pro blessed his executioners, forgave his enemies, and shouted: "Viva el Cristo Rey!-Long Live Christ the King!" his defiant, dying proclamation of ultimate, transcendent loyalty. Father Pro's martyrdom reinvigorated that beleaguered Church, whose countless faithful, never again afraid, would throng John Paul II when he visited Pro's beloved Mexico fifty-two years


