CHRISM MASS - The celebration of the Chrism Mass takes place during Holy Week. Here in our Diocese of Palm Beach it has been a tradition that the Mass be celebrated on Holy Tuesday at the Cathedral of St. Ignatius. Two important parts take place at the Chrism Mass; the Blessing of the Sacred Oils (Oil of Chrism use for Baptism, Confirmation and Holy orders. Oil of Catechumens for the Sacrament of Baptism and Oil of the Sick for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick). and the Renewal of Priestly Promises. At the end of the Mass the sacred oils are distributed to the different parish in our diocese. We, the people of God is the beneficiary of the Chrism Mass. Let us all join for this sacred celebration.





Palm Sunday

With Friends Like These...

This year, we hear the Passion from the gospel of Mark. One thing unique about this reading is the emphasis on Jesus being abandoned by His disciples. First, the leaders of the disciples, Peter, James, and John, cannot even support Jesus in His agony in the garden: They fall asleep, three times. Then there is Judas, who seeks out the chief priests to make a deal with them, Peter, who denies Jesus three times, and the disciples who flee when He is arrested. The crowds who cried, "Hosanna!" a few days before, now call for Him to be crucified. Even Simon the Cyrenian had to be forced to help carry the cross. What does this tell us? With friends like these, who needs enemies? No, the point is that

Jesus died specifically for these people, not because they were once friends, but because they were sinners, who needed Jesus. All but one of them ended up as saints. And the one who didn't was Judas, who gave up on Jesus, instead of coming back to him for forgiveness. When we find ourselves in sin, when we think that everything we do is wrong, or when we

think we can't possibly deserve to be loved by God—that is when God can help us, if we just stop hating ourselves and start loving and trusting the Lord. It is not the time to pretend we have avoided the big sins, or to brag about some of the good we may have done. Instead of trying to convince God that we deserve his mercy, simply agree that you need His help. God

loves sinners who know they need His forgiveness and don't deserve it.

But maybe you have already been forgiven and wonder what's next. Remember the ones you would not expect to support Jesus: The centurion supervising His crucifixion proclaims Him Son of God. A member of the Sanhedrin gives Jesus a burial place. The women who were there to the end. These were people who did not claim to be worthy, just did what they could to show their love. Ask Jesus each morning when you wake up, "What can I do for You today?" and do what you can.

HOLY SATURDAY

God Does Not Make Mistakes

Today, Holy Saturday, there are no "readings of the day," but those of us attending the Easter Vigil will have more than enough Scripture to make up for it. Hearing the readings, we will see a beautiful picture of our salvation won for us in the Paschal Mystery, the apex of human history. This salvation was planned for us from the beginning of time. The readings of the Easter Vigil take us from the creation of the world through the Fall, the wanderings of the Israelites, the promise of the New Covenant, and the Incarnation and Resurrection.

This is a unique opportunity to recognize the providence of God. God had always planned to become man: He knew that we would fall, and He intended to draw us into an even greater reality than that of the Garden of Eden. The Fall did not "surprise" God. He created all things knowing what it would mean. He knew exactly what would unfold, and knew that He would bring good out of it all.

We can hear the wonders of God at the Easter Vigil and still doubt about God's preparedness, or His competence: Why would He have created Adam and Eve for them to fall, or made Abraham's descendants into a great nation for them to constantly break faith with Him? Why would He set up a new and definitive covenant knowing that there would be many who would spurn it? If He knew that this would happen, why did He allow it?

The glory of Easter gives us a glimpse into this, a glory at once confusing and illuminating. We cannot fully grasp the meaning of the death of Jesus Christ. It is hard to understand why God would want to suffer if He could have just created the world differently. But the Resurrection is difficult to argue with. The glory that Jesus shows us we can attain is blinding, more than we could ever deserve.

We may not understand why or how, but God did not make a mistake in ordering the world in the way that He did. The Vigil readings show us that He created a mosaic, full of striking turns and flashes of color that coalesce into something beautiful. By David Dashiell



What is the Church's official position concerning penance and abstinence from meat during Lent?



In 1966 Pope Paul VI reorganized the Church's practice of public penance in his "Apostolic Constitution on Penance" (Poenitemini). The 1983 revision of the Code of Canon Law incorporated the changes made by Pope Paul. Not long after that, the U.S. bishops applied the canonical requirements to the practice of public penance in our country.

To sum up those requirements, Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting as explained by the U.S. bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening-depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal.

Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

What You Should Know About Skin Cancer

Floridians are at great risk for skin cancer due to our year-round exposure to ultraviolet light (UV). About 1 in 5 Americans will develop skin cancer during their lifetime according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.


Fair skin, extensive sun exposure without photo-protection (sunscreen SPF 50), using a tanning salon, a weakened immune system, or a history of organ transplant, can increase your chances of getting a skin cancer. It is important for individuals of all ages to wear sunscreen. Reapply sunscreen every 2-3 hours and wear a wide brimmed hat to protect your ears and neck when outdoors. Wearing long sleeved shirts and swim shirts when in the water will also protect you against UV exposure. Remember the phrase: SLIP, SLOP, SLAP, SEEK, SLIDE: Slip on a shirt, Slop on sunscreen, Slap on a hat, Seek shade, and Slide on sunglasses.

Basal cell (BCC) cancer is the most common type of skin cancer that rarely spreads to other parts of the body and is highly treatable. Watch for a new growth that is getting bigger and may bleed. BCC can look like a skin-colored mole, a pimple, or a red shiny patch.

Squamous cell (SCC) cancer is the second most common skin cancer. Look for a growth that is red and crusty, or a dome shaped lesion that can be sore to touch. When diagnosed early SCC is highly curable. If untreated, it may spread to other parts of the body.

Malignant Melanoma is the third most common skin cancer, but also the most serious. It can appear as a new mole or from an existing mole that has changed. Monitor your skin regularly for the ABCDEs of melanoma: A: asymmetry – one half does not match the other, B: irregular border, C: irregular color, D: over the size of a pencil head eraser, and E: a lesion that is evolving or changing in size. Melanoma is highly treatable if diagnosed early, but it has the potential to spread throughout the body, and therefore; is the deadliest form of skin cancer.

If you notice a red, scaly, bleeding, or growing lesion on your skin, you should see a dermatologist who can perform a skin biopsy to help determine the diagnosis. During a biopsy, the skin is numbed and a small sample is taken for a pathologist to review under a microscope. Depending on the diagnosis, there are several different options for treatment which will be discussed in next week's bulletin.




