





I Trust In You! DIVINE MERCY

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated in the Catholic Church on the Second Sunday of Easter which this year is April 7. Divine Mercy Sunday is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, a polish nun which the faithful believe that in the 1930s Jesus appeared to her and commanded her to write down the message of His mercy. She wrote about the experiences with the Lord in a 600-page diary, now sold around the world. In 2000, St. John Paul II designated that Divine Mercy Sunday to be celebrated each year on the Sunday after Easter. Part of the observance of Divine Mercy Sunday



includes the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, a set of prayers used as part of the Divine Mercy devotion. Additionally, the observance includes the opportunity for the faithful to receive a Plenary Indulgence, a remission of the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The "usual" conditions for seeking a plenary indulgence are Sacramental Confession, Reception of the Holy Communion and Prayer for the Pope's intentions. Additionally related to Divine Mercy Sunday is that one must receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation within 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday, receive Holy Communion on or near the day, and pray the Divine Mercy chaplet or other suitable Divine Mercy prayer as specified by the Church. Three Conditions for the Plenary Indulgence St. John Paul II, motivated by an ardent desire to foster in Christians this devotion to Divine Mercy as much as possible in the hope of offering great spiritual fruit to the faithful. On June 13, 2002, the Pontiff granted the following Indulgences: a plenary indulgence, granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!"); A partial Divine Mercy Prayer

indulgence, granted to the faithful who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation. For those who cannot go to church or the seriously ill In addition, sailors working on the vast expanse of the sea; the countless brothers and sisters, whom the disasters of war, political events, local violence and other such causes have been driven out of their homeland; the sick and those who nurse them, and all who for a just cause cannot leave their homes or who carry out an activity for the community which cannot be postponed, may obtain a plenary indulgence on Divine Mercy Sunday, if totally detesting any sin, as has been said before, and with the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three usual conditions, will recite the Our Father and the Creed before a devout image of Our Merciful Lord Jesus and, in addition, pray a devout invocation to the Merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you). 




Pickleball Injury Prevention

For the past several years, Pickleball has taken over as the fastest growing sport in the U.S., especially among older adults. It's no surprise that emergency room and clinic visits, due to the game, have jumped dramatically. The Mayo Clinic has put together some suggestions to help you enjoy the game while allowing you to stay on the court:

Gear Up – Choose proper court shoes that are comfortable, provide ankle support and have a good grip on the court surface. If you play frequently, replace your shoes after 60 hours of play or every 3 to 4 months, whichever comes first. You wouldn't drive your car on bald tires, good shoes are just as important to prevent falls and associated injuries. Make sure your racket has a good grip that is not slippery.

Warm Up- Pickleball requires quick movements, including bending, twisting, and reaching. Arrive at the court early to stretch and warm up. Follow a stretching routine that loosens the muscles in the arms, legs, back, neck, core, hands and wrists. Start with your feet and work your way up the body. If you experience tennis elbow, try exercises such as raising your wrists then lowering it very slowly. A short jog or brisk walk helps gently raise your heart rate. You don't want to be the one that requires emergency first aid due to a heart event. Drinking lots of water before and during games will prevent dehydration and leg cramps.

Rest Up – Take days off and take breaks between games. Injuries due to overuse of a muscle group are more likely to occur as you age if you have not modified your exercise routine accordingly.

Mix it Up – Build variety into your fitness program. Try to include low-impact activities, such as walking, biking, swimming and water walking, in your routine. Varying your activities helps prevent overuse injuries and allows your body to use different muscle groups and not overload one group. It will also build stamina and cardiovascular fitness.

If you are considering taking up pickleball or any other new strenuous sport, speak to your doctor before venturing into a new physical arena. He or she can give you some helpful advice on how to physically prepare for this new adventure.






