Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Who's More Generous?

Does the Christian duty to help the poor seem to be overwhelming? We hear more and more are out of work, more and more are homeless, and we see more and more pictures of starving children. Even in St. Paul's time there was more than enough poverty to go around. He was trying to build interest (in our second reading) in a project to help the Christians in Jerusalem. We see two of his reasons here.

First he tells what fine Christians they are, and hopes that they will be just as good in giving to his collection. (Reminds me of letters from the bishop, telling parishioners how good and generous they have been in the past.) But Paul isn't just flattering the Corinthians; he is challenging them to continue to show their love for God in their support for fellow Christians. The second reason was to show a good example: By helping the church in Jerusalem, they would show that Christians were united in faith and love for each other. He also doesn't make a competition out of who could be most generous. He expects them to be more interested in love for each other than in outdoing each other.

The main example he uses is Jesus, who made himself poor (i.e., human) so that we could be rich in grace and forgiveness. Paul challenges them, and us, to follow that example in giving from our wealth so that others can survive. Note that he doesn't expect them to live in poverty, just to share what they have out of love for Christ. Perhaps they may need help themselves sometime, and could count on the other church to do the same for them.

Today, we can ask ourselves, "Do I give to the poor because I feel guilty about all that I have? Or do I want to show my love for Jesus when I see him in the poor? Do I give because I want the parish to look more generous than the neighboring parish, or to show that we are all united in concern for each other?" By looking at why we give to charities, we may find ourselves being even more generous than we expected. *Tom Schmidt*

Heat Stroke vs. Heat Exhaustion, Part 2

Last week we talked about the soaring temperatures across the country reaching 100 degrees and up. Heat indexes are even higher making this time of year dangerous for any outdoor activity. This week we will focus on the causes and risk factors of heat stroke and heat exhaustion.

Both heat stroke and heat exhaustion are caused by your body's inability to cool itself. Sweat is your body's natural tool for cooling you down. If you over-exercise or work strenuously in hot weather or a heated room, your body may have difficulty producing enough sweat to keep your body cool. Additional causes of heat exhaustion and heat stroke include: **Dehydration** – when the body loses more fluid than it takes in; **Wearing heavier, tight clothing** – holds in body heat and does not allow the body to cool properly; **Consuming alcohol** – has a diuretic effect on the body causing dehydration.

If you are experiencing heat exhaustion for an extended period of time, it can lead to heat stroke. Heat stroke can come on quickly if it's very hot or you are overexerting yourself. That's why it's important to begin treatment at the first signs of heat exhaustion.

The following factors can increase your risk for heat sensitivity: **AGE** – Infants and children under the age of 4 and adults aged 65 and older are at increased risk for heat-related illnesses. That's because your body's ability to regulate temperature is more difficult at these ages. **PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS** – some medications used for high blood pressure or heart conditions may reduce your body's ability to stay hydrated. **OBESITY** – Your body retains more heat when you weigh more. It can also be more difficult to cool your body down if you are overweight or obese. **SUDDEN TEMPERATURE CHANGES** – When you rapidly move from a colder to a warmer climate, like going on a vacation in a hotter location, your body may not be able to adjust to the warmer weather. **A HIGH HEAT INDEX** – we are experiencing this in many areas of the country. Heat index is a measurement that factors in humidity along with the outside temperature to determine how hot it feels to you and your body. If the humidity is high, your sweat evaporates more easily and you may have a harder time cooling yourself down. If the heat index is greater than 91 degrees F., you should focus on prevention methods.

Next week we will focus on diagnosis, when it is an emergency, and treatment.


