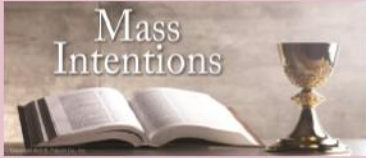


Respect Life Prayer


Farewell & Thank You Tedy Charles

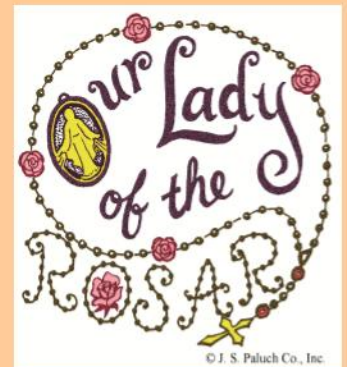

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Using beads for prayer and meditation is an ancient custom, found in many cultures and religions. The Christian rosary dates from the twelfth century, when it provided a way for ordinary Christians to learn about the lives of Jesus and Mary. Alan de la Roche, a fifteenth-century Dominican, preferred “Psalter of Our Lady” to “rosary.” This fitting name recalls an explanation of the devotion’s origin. Unable to read the one hundred fifty psalms that formed the Church’s “official” daily prayer, medieval Christians substituted first one hundred fifty Pater Nosters, and later one hundred fifty Ave Marias. By meditating on the various mysteries of the rosary while repeating these simple prayers, the faithful could immerse themselves in the whole mystery of the Incarnation and the Resurrection.

The dedication of October to the Blessed Virgin Mary is an appropriate reminder of this venerable form of prayer. Faithful Christians everywhere continue to meditate on the mysteries of the rosary, praying in groups or alone. Why not take advantage of this season to renew your acquaintance with the rosary?

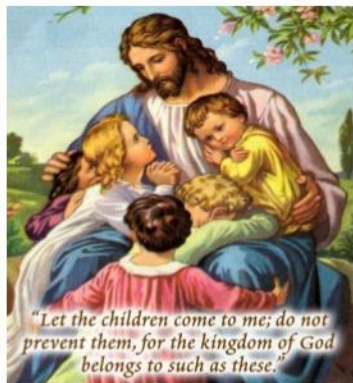
Reflections

Listening and Loving

Jesus insists that the little children can come to Him. He is available to them just as much as He is to the adults, much to the shock of the adults surrounding Him. Jesus then asks those shocked adults to consider how these children have qualities the adults are lacking. "Whoever does not accept the Kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." As I pondered the qualities a child has, the Holy Spirit drew my attention to an aspirational prayer in a Mass journal I have.

Breathe in: Give me ears that listen
Breathe out: and a heart that loves

I found myself considering how these two motions, listening and loving, are foundational to the childhood experience and are both crucial to accept the Kingdom of God.



First, we have to listen. As children, our first experience of the world is sound. Even before we are born, babies can hear the sounds of the world outside of their mother. A young baby, days old, can barely see a few feet beyond themselves, but their hearing is perfect. They soak in sounds, language. We learn to speak first by hearing it. "At birth, the infant brain can perceive the full set of 800 or so sounds, called phonemes, that can be strung together to form all the words in every language of the world" (Patricia K. Kuhl, *How Babies Learn Language*, 2015). This is incredible! We have such a huge capacity for language, both to listen to and speak, as small children that fades as we grow more set in our ways as adults.

Simultaneously, babies are learning about what it means to be loved, to be cared for. They are completely reliant on their parents to love them. To love someone, to will the good of the other, is foundational for a child. As the child grows, they come to consciously perceive this and begin to freely offer that love back to their family. At lunch a few days ago, my three year old looked up and said, "Mommy, I love you. The next day, I will love you still." It was spontaneous and spoken from his heart.

Jesus wants to speak to us. He does so in the language we understand with our ears through the people He has placed in our lives. He also speaks to our hearts, in the language of love. These two practices, listening and loving, are beautiful lessons we can strive to grow in while we seek to become more childlike in the eyes of God.

“Let the little children come to Me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.” Mark 10:14-15

Examples of children’s innocent nature and their trust level is often compared to adults' hard hearts. Our hardness of heart comes from years of intellectual bombardment of knowledge and emotions that create a barrier in understanding scripture and its truth. This even prevents us at times from even understanding the scriptures.

Rather than becoming a barrier, reason should be coupled with humility to become a source for a deeper bond with Christ. God created us as intelligent beings with free will, but above everything, He always wants us to stay humble in life, to approach Him with a humble heart. A humble heart is always exalted by the Lord. *“Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.”* Matthew 18:4

So as the scriptures remind us, let us shovel aside all our pride and ego that cause stiffness of heart and always approach Him with a humble heart, to love Him, and to absorb the graces with a childlike heart.

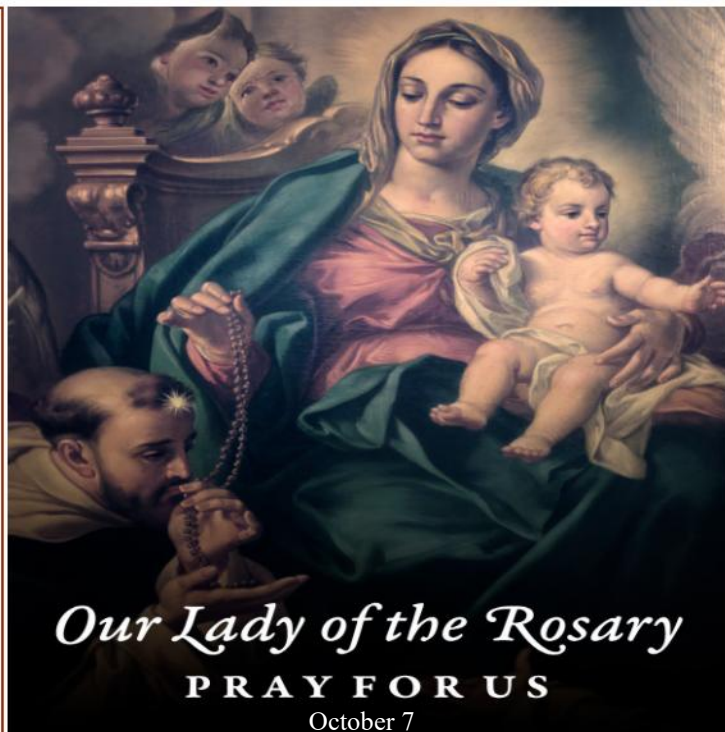

Crohn's Disease, Part One

Crohn's Disease, according to the Mayo Clinic, is a type of inflammatory bowel disease (IBD). It causes swelling of the tissues (inflammation) in your digestive tract, which can lead to abdominal pain, severe diarrhea, fatigue, weight loss and malnutrition. Inflammation caused by Crohn's disease can involve different areas of the digestive tract in different people, most commonly the small intestine. This inflammation often spreads into the deeper layers of the bowel.

Crohn's disease can be both painful and debilitating, and sometimes may lead to life-threatening complications. There's no known cure for Crohn's disease, but therapies can greatly reduce its signs and symptoms and even bring about long-term remission and healing of inflammation. With treatment, many people with Crohn's disease are able to function well.

In Crohn's disease, any part of your small or large intestine can be involved. It may involve multiple segments, or it may be continuous. In some people, the disease is only in the colon, which is part of the large intestine. Signs and symptoms of Crohn's disease can range from mild to severe. They usually develop gradually, but sometimes will come on suddenly, without warning. You may also have periods of time when you have no signs or symptoms (remission).

Symptoms - When the disease is active, symptoms typically include: Diarrhea; Fever; Fatigue; Abdominal pain and cramping; Blood in your stool; Mouth sores; Reduced appetite and weight loss; and Pain or drainage near or around the anus due to inflammation from a tunnel into the skin (fistula).

Other signs and symptoms - People with severe Crohn's disease may also experience symptoms outside of the intestinal tract, including: Inflammation of skin, eyes and joints; Inflammation of the liver or bile ducts; Kidney stones; Iron deficiency (anemia); and possibly, Delayed growth or sexual development, in children.

When to see a doctor - See your doctor if you have persistent changes in your bowel habits or if you have any of the signs and symptoms of Crohn's disease, such as: Abdominal pain; Blood in your stool; Nausea and vomiting; Diarrhea lasting more than two weeks; Unexplained weight loss; and Fever in addition to any of the above symptoms.

Next week, we will cover the causes, risk factors, and complications of Crohn's Disease.
