Pope Francis Canonizes 14 New Saints

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2024 - Pilgrims gathered in St. Peter Square for a Mass and Canonization for 14 new saints. Thousands of pilgrims prayed the Litany of the Saints together.

St. Giuseppe Allamano - a diocesan priest from Italy, founder of Consolata Missionary Orders. His spiritual director was St. John Bosco.

St. Marie - Leonie Paradis - "Humble Among the Humble", from Montreal, Canada. Founded an order for service of priests.

St. Elena Guerra - "Apostle of the Holy Spirit" She composed prayers to the Holy Spirit including the Holy Spirit Chaplet asking the Lord to "*send forth Your Spirit and renew the world*."

St. Manuel Ruiz and his Seven Franciscan Companions - Martyrs of Damascus: Courageous Witnesses of Faith. Father Carmelo Bolta, Father Nicanor Ascanio, Father Nicolás M. Alberca y Torres, Father Pedro Soler, Kolland, Brother Francisco Pinazo Peñalver and Brother Juan S. Fernández. These men where attacked in a church in the Christian quarter of Damascus. They were killed for refusing to renounce their Christian faith and convert to Islam.

Sts. Francis, Abdel Mooti and Raphael Massabki. Three laymen who were brothers and who gave deep piety and devotion to the Christian Faith. They were offered to live if they renounced their faith but they refused. "We are Christians, and we want to live and die as Christians,"

"We confidently ask for their intercession so that we too can follow Christ, follow Him in service and become witnesses of hope for the world," the Pope said.





Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Man of Many Talents

When you think of Jesus, what do you think was His job? Healer of the sick, the lame and the blind, as in today's gospel? Preacher? Teacher? Leader of men? Messiah? The second reading from Hebrews reminds us of His main duty: Priest. It calls Him a High Priest, referring to the Jewish priesthood in which one priest was chosen each year to offer the most important sacrifices and so appeal to God for forgiveness of the peoples' sins. Now this may sound like primitive religion, but it actually lets us understand Jesus even better.

The high priest offered sacrifice for His own sins, as well as the peoples'. While Jesus did not sin, He experienced temptations just as we do and so can intercede for us as one who knows what it is like to be tempted. He also knows suffering, from His passion and death on the cross. If you ever wonder if you deserve to be forgiven, remember that Jesus died for all sinners, deserving or not. The High Priest was the one to bring the Israelites prayers to God and God's blessings to the people. Jesus also brings our prayers to his Father and shows us the Father's love.

Our baptism gives us a share in that priesthood. You don't have to be ordained to pray for your friends and family. You don't have to be a bishop to bring God's love to those around you. When you listen to a friend who is hurting, or forgive someone who hurts you, you are blessing them with God's love. When you encourage them to have faith and trust in the Lord, you are bringing them to God. You are sharing in the priesthood of Christ. *Tom Schmidt*

He Threw Aside His Cloak

Jesus has come to destroy all the enemies of our fullness of life with God, and restore humanity's trust in the love of the Father, which Adam and Eve had rejected. But He respects our freedom and waits for us to ask in trust, to open ourselves in trust to His grace and power, and to receive in trust all that He longs to give us.

Bartimaeus is a blind beggar. His physical eyes see no light; but his eyes of faith see clearly that Jesus is the Promised One, the One who will reestablish the Davidic Kingdom, the Messiah, his only hope. So he cries out for help, even as others tell him to stop, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" His trusting faith is the source of his persistence. And Love stops for him and calls him. In response, Bartimaeus throws off the one thing that belongs to him, the only protection he has, the one thing he can depend on - his cloak – and allows himself to be led to Jesus. Jesus asks him what he wants and listens to his desire. "Master, I want to see," Bartimaeus says simply, in confident faith. And with a word from the Lord, he can see.

What Bartimaeus does next is the key to understanding the whole story. On receiving his sight, we are told, Bartimaeus "followed Him on the way." When faith is engaged, when we trust fully, when our eyes are opened, we must follow the Lord.

Where do we need Christ's healing in our lives, our minds, our hearts? Where is our faith weak, our trust flailing, our eyes clouded? What do we need to lift up in trusting faith to Love's powerful gaze? What cloak of self-sufficiency do we cling to, that might be holding us back from a blind confidence in God's loving Providence? How willing are we to throw it aside to be led to Christ?



"Then Jesus said to him, "What do you want Me to do for you?" The blind man said to Him, 'My teacher, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has made you well.' Immediately he regained his sight and followed Him on the way." (Mark 10:51-52)

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Breast Cancer Awareness Month can be a good reminder to learn more about breast cancer, the risk factors for you and those you love (and how to minimize them) and the importance of being screened for the disease.

Breast Cancer awareness: Statistics

Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer among American women.

- Black women are most likely to die from breast cancer than women of any other racial or ethnic group. Researchers believe that it's partially because 1 in 5 Black women is diagnosed with triple-negative breast cancer, more than any other racial or ethnic group, (it's harder to treat, treatment options are fewer and it's more aggressive).
- About 85% of breast cancers occur in women who have no family history of breast cancer. These occur due to genetic mutations that happen as a result of the aging process, environmental exposures and life in general, rather than inherited mutations.
- Approximately 2,710 American men this year are expected to be diagnosed with breast cancer, and about 530 are expected to die from the disease. Lack of awareness and stigma can be barriers to detection and care.

Breast cancer risk factors you cannot change:

Getting older. The risk for breast cancer increases with age.

- Genetic mutations. Women who have inherited changes (mutations) to certain genes, such as BRCA1 and BRCA2, are at higher risk of breast and ovarian cancer.
- Reproductive history. Starting menstrual periods before age 12 and starting menopause after age 55 expose women to hormones longer, raising their risk of getting breast cancer.
- Having dense breasts. Dense breasts have more connective tissue than fatty tissue, which can sometimes make it difficult to see tumors on a mammogram. Women with dense breasts are more likely to get breast cancer.
- Personal history of breast cancer or certain non-cancerous breast diseases. Women with a history of breast cancer are more likely to get breast cancer a second time. Non-cancerous breast diseases such as atypical ductal hyperplasia or lobular carcinoma *in situ (in the original or appropriate position)* are associated with a higher risk of getting breast cancer.
- Family history of breast or ovarian cancer. A woman's risk for breast cancer is higher if she has a mother, sister, or daughter (first-degree relative) or multiple family members on either her mother's or father's side of the family who have had breast or ovarian cancer.
- Previous treatment using radiation therapy. Women who had radiation therapy to the chest or breasts (as in treatment of Hodgkin's lymphoma) before age 30 have a higher risk of getting breast cancer later in life.
- Exposure to the drug **diethylstilbestrol (DES).** DES was given to some pregnant women in the U.S. between 1940 and 1971 to prevent miscarriage. Women who took DES and women whose mothers took DES while pregnant with them also may have a higher risk of getting breast cancer.

Breast cancer can be cured if discovered early. See you doctor for regular check-ups and get screened.
