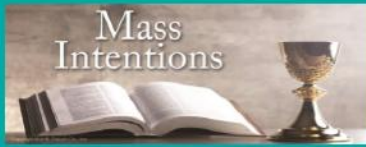

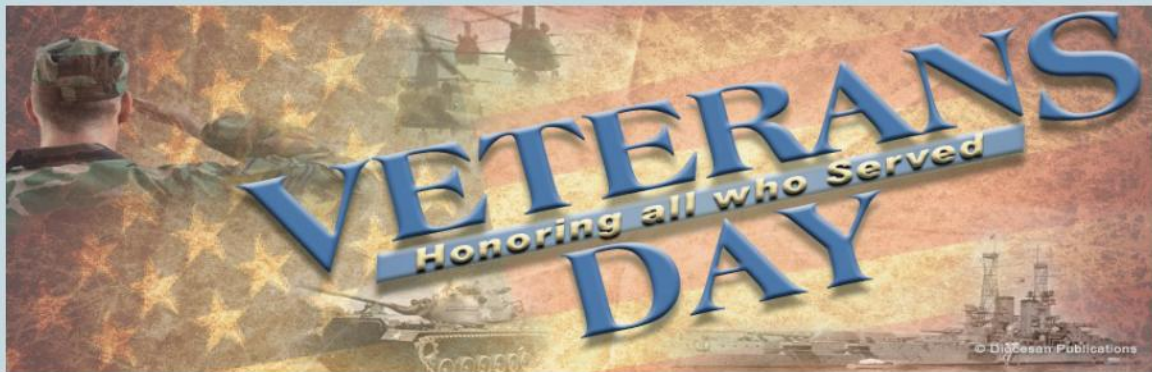

Reflections

She Contributed Her WHOLE LIVELIHOOD

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time A Lot of Nerve

I always thought it took a lot of nerve for Elijah to beg that poor woman for a meal. Even though, during a long drought, she has only a bit of her food to give to her son, he still asks her to make a little cake for himself. It would be easier to understand if we heard the verse before this reading begins: God tells the prophet that he has “commanded a widow...to feed you.” (1Kgs 17:9)

Now the widow was not aware of this command. But she does as Elijah asked. That took even more faith than Elijah showed. She was afraid for herself and the boy. But she had enough faith to risk the last of her food to help someone else. She shows us that we are obeying God’s commands when we trust him. Most of those commands come not from a vision, but from someone’s cry for help.

I wonder how many good people have passed up a chance to do God’s will because they didn’t hear directly from God what to do. When you hear that a tornado destroyed a nearby neighborhood, do you hear God asking you to help? Do you hear God’s voice when you read in the bulletin that the food pantry is running low? When a storm knocks out the power on your block, do you think God is asking you to check on the elderly widow next door?

And if you do hear God calling in these examples, how do you respond? You can be like the rich people in the gospel and just give your ten percent. Or do you have the faith of the woman whose few cents were all that she had. It takes a lot of courage to trust God completely. Do you have what it takes?

All-In

A student learns from their teacher and then goes out and lives their own life using what they have learned. A disciple seeks to emulate their master, living their life in imitation of their master as much as possible. Yes, Jesus was a teacher, but we are not merely students. We are disciples who seek to model our life after His, and Jesus was all-in. Today’s Gospel gives us a model of what discipleship looks and sounds like in real life.

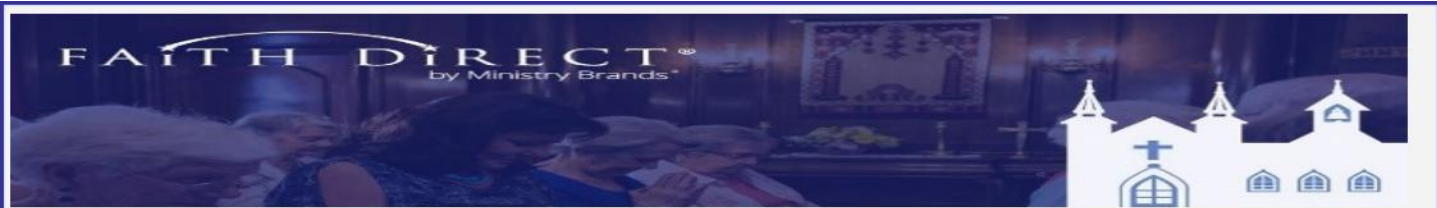
Jesus didn’t come to do things halfway. Fully God and fully man, He experiences all of our life. He cries at the death of loved ones. He offers love and tenderness to those who reject Him. He frequents the homes of those considered less than others, on the fringes of society. He is fully one of us. He goes all in, offering His very body and blood in atonement so that we do not have to be separated from God. After His resurrection, He still eats with the disciples, not out of His need, but out of theirs. He institutes the Eucharist, where He is forever humbled to be present in the bread and wine. Jesus is all-in in everything He does.

Likewise the widow. No one would blame her for giving less. After all, she is a widow. She has no one to take care of her and provide for her. But her response to God’s call to give, is to give everything. She leaves it all there trusting God to provide her daily bread.

Are we all-in? When we give, do we give from our excess or from our need? Is our gift to God from our first fruits or our leftovers? It isn’t just money! What about our time? Life in our society is so crazy fast! We are on the move from the moment we wake until we fall into our beds again at night. When our feet hit the floor, do we take time to thank God for the gift of another day or are we already at a run, tackling our never ending to-do list?

People used to sanctify their day by stopping when they heard the Church bells to pray and reconnect with God. In today’s world, the Church bells have been drowned out by all the other sounds of modern society. How do we stop and reconnect with God, our Source and our Creator, throughout the day? Do we invite God into all parts of our life or do we save some portion of ourselves for ourselves? How close, or how far away are we from going all-in? The widow sets a high bar for us.

Dear Lord, help me to be like the widow. Help me to be all-in. Let all that I do bring glory to You and reflect Your love back into the world. May I truly be Your disciple, not just your student. Amen.

Big Changes for Medicare Plans in 2025

An estimated five million people with either have to get a new Medicare health plan or Part D drug plan as a result of the changes. The following are the key Medicare changes coming in 2025, focusing on Part D, which covers prescription drugs:

\$2,000 Out-of-Pocket Cap for Part D Drugs – Medicare will introduce a \$2,000 annual cap on out-of-pocket expenses for Part D drugs. This is a major improvement from previous years, where enrollees could face much higher costs during the catastrophic phase. This cap does not apply to Part D drugs like chemotherapy administered in clinics.

Elimination of the Coverage Gap known as the Donut Hole – The “donut hole,” a phase where enrollees bore a larger share of drug costs, will be removed. Medicare beneficiaries will now transition from initial coverage to catastrophic coverage without facing sudden cost increases.

New Monthly Prescription Payment Plan – Medicare will offer a new payment option, allowing beneficiaries to spread out their out-of-pocket drug expenses over monthly installments rather than paying all costs upfront. The total cost will still be subject to the \$2,000 cap.

Impact on Part D Plans and Insurers – Drug manufacturers and insurance plans will take on a larger share of costs during the catastrophic phase, reducing Medicare’s burden. Also, manufacturers will offer a 10% discount on brand-name drugs in the initial coverage phase.

Now for the bad news -- **Cons of Medicare Advantage (MA) Plans** – Monthly premiums may be between \$ 0 and \$200 a month, but often will come with trade-offs including:

Narrower Provider Networks – Many MA plans limit access to specific doctors and hospitals, meaning beneficiaries may need to switch providers to avoid higher costs of out-of-network physicians and hospitals who have chosen to leave MA plans.

Costly Formularies – Plans can make formulary changes, such as dropping high-cost drugs or requiring additional steps (like step therapy) before covering medications, potentially complicating treatment for beneficiaries.

Increased Out-of-Pocket Costs – Although MA plans cap total out-of-pocket spending for covered services, beneficiaries may face higher deductibles and co-pays, especially as insurers adjust premiums to offset their costs for new Part D benefits.

Limited Coverage Flexibility – MA plans may change coverage terms, such as reducing or eliminating benefits for supplemental services such as: Silver Sneakers, dental, or vision, etc.

Picking a plan isn’t simple, and it is important to get unbiased advice. Talk with your current insurer to learn about the planned changes to your policy for 2025. To find real, impartial information, it is best to start with Medicare’s own website, **Medicare.gov** or call for more information at **1-800-MEDICARE**.
