




### Pope Francis Prayer for Peace



### **Jubilee Indulgence**

The Jubilee Indulgence is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy, which goes beyond and transforms the boundaries of human justice. This treasury of grace entered human history in the witness of Jesus and the saints, and by living in communion with them our hope for our own forgiveness is strengthened and becomes a certainty. The Jubilee indulgence allows us to free our hearts from the weight of sin because the reparation due for our sins is given freely and abundantly.

In practical terms, the experience of God's mercy involves some spiritual acts indicated by the Pope. Those who cannot make the Jubilee pilgrimage due to illness or other circumstances are nonetheless invited to take part in the spiritual movement that accompanies the Jubilee year, offering up the sufferings of their daily lives, and participating in the Eucharistic celebration.

Pilgrimage to the Holy Doors\*; Participate in the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist (usually within 8 days of pilgrimage); Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.

## SPES NON CONFUNDIT (Papal Bull declaring Jubilee 2025)

I hereby decree that the Holy Door of the Basilica of Saint Peter in the Vatican will be opened on 24 December 2024, thus inaugurating the Ordinary Jubilee. On the following Sunday, 29 December 2024, I will open the Holy Door of my cathedral, Saint John Lateran, which on 9 November this year will celebrate the 1700th anniversary of its dedication. Then, on 1 January 2025, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, the Holy Door of the

Papal Basilica of Saint Mary Major will be opened. Finally, Sunday, 5 January 2025, will mark the opening of the Holy Door of the Papal Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls. These last three Holy Doors will be closed on Sunday, 28 December 2025 . . . The Ordinary Jubilee will conclude with the closing of the Holy Door in the Papal Basilica of Saint Peter in the Vatican on 6 January 2026, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. (6).

### \*The Holy Door

The Vatican has reserved the status of "Holy Door" to the main doors of all Cathedrals and Basilicas around the world. In the past the diocesan bishop was able to designate additional churches in the diocese, but only the Cathedral of Saint Ignatius Loyola will have the designation for Jubilee 2025.

I have published the Jubilee calendar highlighting the special days reserved for particular groups to visit the Holy Doors. Parishes are encouraged to publish the relevant dates for the particular groups so that those not able to make the pilgrimage to Rome can do so at the diocesan Cathedral. Those physically not able to make a pilgrimage to Rome or the diocesan cathedral are encouraged to make a "pilgrimage in spirit" to pray for those making a physical pilgrimage.

### Hygiene Etiquette: Stopping the Spread of Colds and Flu

We live in sunny South Florida where the temperatures in December average in the mid to upper 70's. We are immune to colds and flu viruses, right? Unfortunately, NO! Each year, during the holidays, hundreds of visitors come to our area from cities with cold and flu viruses in abundance, or we travel to colder climates and are exposed to these "bugs" during our trips. Add now the possibility of catching RSV or COVID, the Christmas/New Year season adds another layer of concern.

Did you know that people with colds or flu can spread it to others up to 6 feet away? Per the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, a single sneeze travels at approximately 100 miles/per hour, and can send 100,000 germs into the air. If you are not vaccinated against the flu, RSV or COVID, what could that mean for you?

It is common knowledge that when we cough or sneeze, we should cover our mouth and nose with a tissue to prevent germs from becoming airborne. Now research from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology suggests this instruction is more important than ever; they have found that droplets from coughs or sneezes can travel up to 200 times farther than previously thought.

Hygiene etiquette involves practices that prevent the spread of illness and disease. Serious respiratory illnesses like influenza, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), whooping cough, COVID, and severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) are spread by: coughing or sneezing; unclean hands – touching your face, mouth or eyes after touching contaminated objects, or touching objects after contaminating your hands.

To help stop the spread of germs: Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, put your used tissue in a waste basket. Wear a mask when in crowds even if you are vaccinated. Always wash your hands after coughing or sneezing with soap and water, or if soap and water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

One final practice that helps prevent the spread of respiratory disease is avoiding close contact with people who are sick. If you are ill, you should try to distance yourself from others so you do not spread your germs. Distancing includes staying home from work, school or church while ill.

Let's all do our part to help ourselves and others have a Healthy and Happy New Year!
