



WHO IS THIS KING OF GLORY? *IT IS THE LORD*

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord Unwavering Fidelity to God's Will

In the old tradition of the Church, the Christmas season was celebrated up until this day, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This allowed for 40 days of bringing to mind the glorious day of Christ's birth on earth, similar to the 40 days we celebrate from Easter Sunday until the Feast of the Ascension. While current calendars have us taking down our trees at the Baptism of the Lord, just three short Sundays after the Nativity, today's Feast still holds great significance.

Jesus, our Lord and Savior, was born into a humble Jewish family. His parents were faithful to God's will, whether it be agreeing to a supernatural conception, following instructions given in dreams or fleeing to a foreign land. On this day, they were called to carry out a religious custom. 40 days after birth, the family was to bring their child to the temple to dedicate him to the Lord. A sacrifice was brought for the ritual offering, normally a lamb, but since Mary and Joseph were of humble means, they brought either a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons.

But perhaps the most surprising element of this event is the fact that the Holy Family falls into the background. They are not the main characters in this story, but rather two elderly individuals who seemingly come out of the woodwork when the Christ Child is brought into the temple. Simeon and Anna, two righteous and devout people who were awaiting the redemption of Israel, were chosen as some of the first people whose eyes lit up upon seeing our Savior! In fact, Simeon even got to hold Him in his arms!

And that is why some still call this day "Candlemas" as well. They bless candles that symbolize Jesus as the Light of the World. Simeon and Anna experienced first hand the splendor of the Lord and went on to give thanks to God and speak about the child to all who would listen. The light that shone forth from the tiny Babe, went on to shine forth through them, for Jesus illuminates all the nations.

As we gaze upon the unwavering fidelity of Simeon and Anna, Mary and Joseph, what will our response be? Let us ask for the intercession of these saints to imitate their prayerful faithfulness. May we always be ready to follow God's will in our lives and present all that we are to Him in love. *Tami Urcia*



THE HOLY FAMILY – A MODEL OF HUMILITY

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord,") and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." (Luke 2:22-24)

Through divine revelation, Joseph and Mary were aware of who Jesus was before His birth. Throughout scripture nowhere do we see pride in their speech or in their actions. Rather their humility is elucidated in every situation. Despite being the parents of the Almighty, they never felt or behaved as though they were entitled to special treatment. Rather, they did everything every other law-abiding Israelite was expected to do.

Even in their poverty, their enriched hearts were always ready to be submissive to the precepts of God. Neither their knowledge nor their identity as parents of Jesus -Son of God stood in the way of their obedience. Of the many outstanding qualities of

How to Get the Most Out of Your Next Doctor's Visit

Most doctors have patients back-to-back through out the day, and sometimes you feel you are being rushed out the door before covering all your concerns. The following tips will make it easier for you and your doctor to cover all you need to discuss.

Make a list and prioritize your concerns. Do you have new symptoms you want to ask your doctor about? Are you concerned about how a treatment is affecting your daily life? Do you want to get a flu shot? If you need to discuss several items, write them down and prioritize the most important ones first. Don't put off telling your doctor what your concerns are until the end of the appointment; bring them up right away. Let your doctor know what has happened in your life since your last visit. If you have been treated in the emergency room or by a specialist, tell the doctor right away. Be concise and thorough when talking to your doctor.

Take information with you to the doctor. Write down all your prescription drugs, over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, herbal remedies or supplements along with strength and dosage. (example: atorvastatin, 20 mg, once a day); If you find this too difficult, then put all the items you take in a bag and bring them with you. You should also take your identification, insurance cards, names and phone numbers of other doctors you see, and your medical records if the doctor doesn't already have them. If you are seeing a new doctor, write down your previous illnesses, operations, and current medical conditions.

Consider bringing a family member or friend to the doctor's office. Four ears can be better than two when visiting a doctor. Let your family member or friend know in advance what you want from your visit. Your companion can also take notes for you and can help you remember what the doctor said. Remember the visit is between you and the doctor. You may want personal time alone with the doctor. Unless your family member or friend is part of your health care team, you can ask him or her to stay in the waiting room for part of the appointment.

Be sure you can see and hear as well as possible. Remember to take your eyeglasses to the doctor's visit. If you have a hearing aid, make sure it is working well and wear it. When making your appointment, if English is not your primary language or the doctor doesn't speak your language, bring a friend who can interpret for you. Always let the doctor, your interpreter, or the staff know if you do not understand your diagnosis or the instructions the doctor gives you.

Doctors appreciate patients who are prepared for their appointments. A little advance planning can go a long way for you and your doctor.
