


BIBLE STUDY COMING SOON

Jubilee Indulgence

The Jubilee Indulgence is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy, which goes beyond and transforms the boundaries of human justice. This treasury of grace entered human history in the witness of Jesus and the saints, and by living in communion with them our hope for our own forgiveness is strengthened and becomes a certainty. The Jubilee Indulgence allows us to free our hearts from the weight of sin because the reparation due for our sins is given freely and abundantly.

In practical terms, the experience of God's mercy involves some spiritual acts indicated by the Pope. Those who cannot make the Jubilee pilgrimage due to illness or other circumstances are nonetheless invited to take part in the spiritual movement that accompanies the Jubilee year, offering up the sufferings of their daily



lives, and participating in the Eucharistic celebration.

Pilgrimage to the Holy Doors*; Participate in the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist (usually within 7 days of pilgrimage); Pray for the Intentions of the Holy Father.

*The Holy Door

The Vatican has reserved the status of "Holy Door" to the main doors of all Cathedrals and Basilicas around the world. In the past the diocesan bishop was able to designate additional churches in the diocese, but only the Cathedral of Saint Ignatius Loyola will have the designation for Jubilee 2025.



Would you know if you were having a heart attack?

February is American Heart Month, and the American Heart Association wants all adults to be informed of the warning signs and to be able to react quickly if they experience symptoms. Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most start slowly. That's why it's so important to know the early warning signs, and what to do if you experience them.

Women can experience vague or silent symptoms that can easily be missed. Men often report classic symptoms that are unmistakable. Symptoms may include:

Women report pain in the chest that feels like squeezing (vice like) or fullness anywhere in the chest area not just the left side. Most men report pain beginning in the left arm and then escalating crushing chest pain that feels like heavy pressure as if an elephant was sitting on them.

Both men and women can experience shortness of breath. Heart attack sufferers can have trouble breathing without exertion. Women may not experience chest pain, but men usually experience chest pain along with difficulty breathing.

Women report pain in arm(s), back, neck or jaw. Pain can be gradual or sudden, and may wax and wane before becoming intense. If you're asleep, it may wake you up. You should report any "not typical or unexplained" symptoms in any part of your body above your waist to your health care provider.

Nausea: women often dismiss flu-like symptoms as something less serious.

Stomach pain. Women often mistake stomach pain that signals a heart attack with heartburn, the flu, or a stomach ulcer.

Extreme fatigue: a sense of unusual or extreme tiredness that can last for days or weeks can be a sign of heart disease. This symptom has been reported by both men and women.

Fainting and lightheadedness: can involve dizziness, extreme weakness or anxiety.

Sweating: in women, these unusual cold sweats can feel similar to hormonal hot flashes or night sweats.

Not everyone experiences classic symptoms with the same intensity. If you are unsure, don't ignore these signs. Seek medical help immediately.
