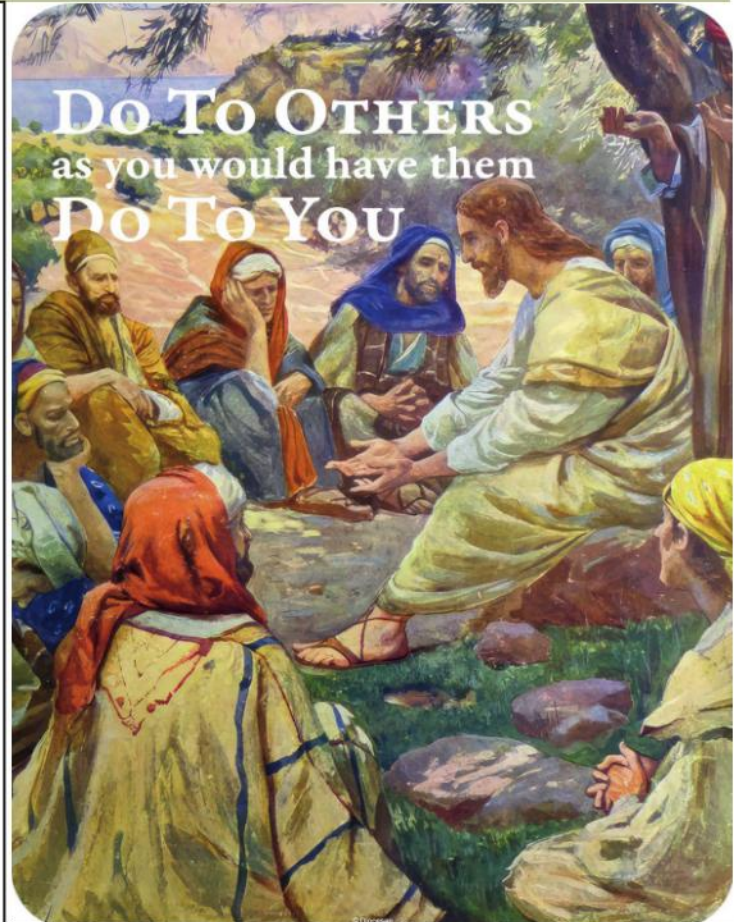

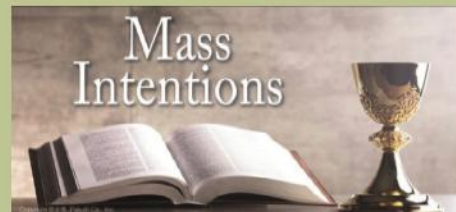

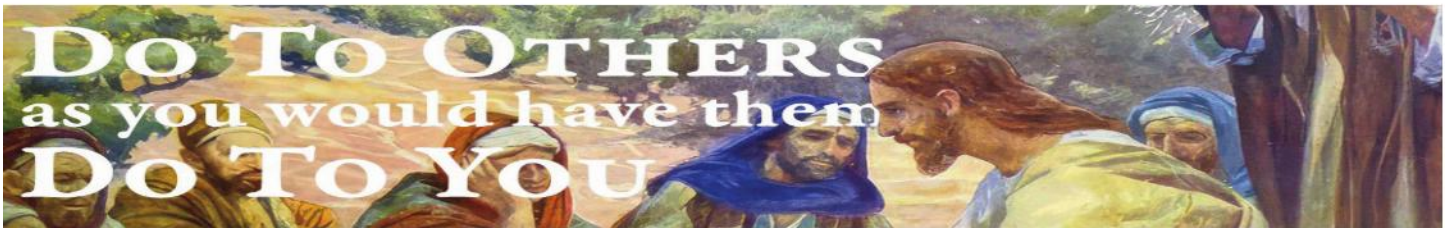


PRAY THE ROSARY

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Stagnant or Overflowing?

We find ourselves in the midst of a short, seven and a half week stint of Ordinary Time. It can seem like we are somewhat lost in time - no longer in the Christmas season and not yet in the throes of Lent. It can also be a dreary time. All of the exterior lights are extinguished; the days are still short and the nights still long. The gray clouds and threats of snow linger on in some parts, yet without the childlike anticipation to pull us through. What do we have to look forward to now? How can we not grow stagnant in our walk of faith during this time?

A friend once told me that Ordinary Time was his favorite season of all. When he first said it, I thought he was crazy. How can anyone enjoy Ordinary Time more than Christmas or Easter?! But then he shared that, just as the liturgical color green indicates, Ordinary Time is a season of growth. As we muddle through the mundane, tackle the trivial and battle the boredom, we are invited to continue blossoming and blooming.

In today's first reading we discover Saul and David in the middle of a cat and mouse chase. Saul finds himself in a jealous rage and wishes to extinguish David, while David's men encourage him to obliterate Saul. David could have just as easily become enraged. After all, his best friend's father wanted to chop his head off! But he fled in self defense, and when afforded the opportunity to retaliate, refused to lay a finger on the Lord's anointed one. He acquiesced to God rather than anger.

Jesus puts the actions of David into words saying: "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you... Do to others as you would have them do to you...and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked." Sounds selfless and saintly and... super hard. To act in a way that gains no reward, not even a tiny bit of dopamine, sounds just horrible. It offers my humanness no motivation, my pride no boost.

Yet we live for the promise of a different kind of reward all together: "then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High... gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down and overflowing..." So let us shake off the ordinariyness of this time and dive into the growth, so that our heavenly reward may be overflowing.

Stroke Awareness: What Everyone Needs to Know

Every year, thousands of lives are changed by strokes—a leading cause of death and disability in the United States. But the good news? Many strokes are preventable, and recognizing the warning signs can save lives. Let's take a closer look at strokes, the different types, and how to act quickly if you suspect one.

What Is a Stroke? A stroke happens when blood flow to the brain is interrupted, depriving brain cells of oxygen and nutrients. Without quick treatment, brain cells can die, leading to lasting damage.

Types of Strokes

There are three main types of strokes:

1. Ischemic Stroke: The most common type, caused by a blood clot or other obstruction blocking blood flow to the brain.
2. Hemorrhagic Stroke: Occurs when a blood vessel in the brain bursts, leading to bleeding in or around the brain.
3. Transient Ischemic Attack (TIA): Often called a "mini-stroke," this temporary blockage doesn't cause permanent damage but is a serious warning sign of a future stroke.

Recognizing the Warning Signs

When it comes to strokes, every second counts. The American Stroke Association emphasizes the importance of knowing the F.A.S.T. acronym to spot stroke signs:

- **F**ace drooping: Does one side of the face droop or feel numb? Ask the person to smile.
- **A**rm weakness: Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one drift downward?
- **S**peech difficulty: Is speech slurred, or is the person unable to speak or hard to understand? Ask them to repeat a simple sentence.
- **T**ime to call 911: If someone shows any of these signs, even if they go away, call 911 immediately.

By staying informed and acting quickly, you can make a life-saving difference for yourself or someone else. Remember, recognizing the signs and responding fast is critical when it comes to strokes. Spread the word and help raise awareness today!
