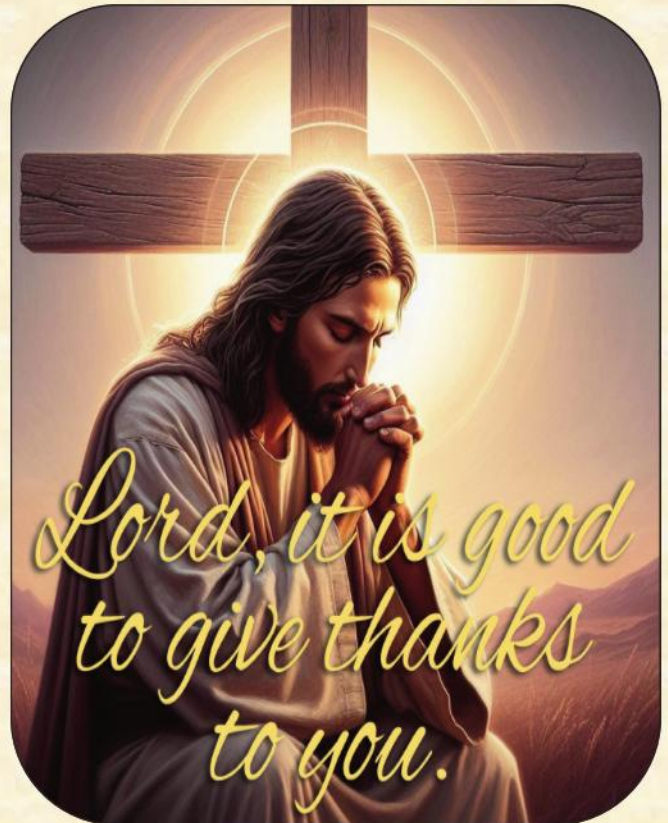

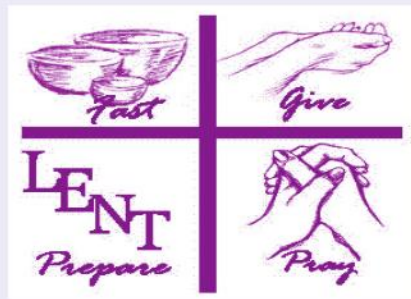

Our observance of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. At Mass on **Ash Wednesday (March 5th, 2025)**, the imposition of ashes replicates an ancient penitential practice and symbolizes our dependence upon God's mercy and forgiveness.

During Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

The three traditional pillars of Lenten observance are **Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving**. The Church asks us to surrender ourselves to prayer and to the reading of Scripture, to fasting and to giving alms. The fasting that all do together on Fridays is but a sign of the daily Lenten discipline of individuals and households; fasting for certain period of time, fasting from certain food, but also fasting from other things and activities. Likewise, the giving of alms is some effort to share this world equally - not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents.

The key to fruitful observance of these practices is to recognize their link to baptismal renewal. We are called not just to abstain from sin during Lent, but to true conversion of our hearts and minds as followers of Christ. We recall those water in which we are baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and-evil, and began new life in Christ.

What is the Church's official position concerning penance and abstinence from meat during Lent?



In 1966 Pope Paul VI reorganized the Church's practice of public penance in his "Apostolic Constitution on Penance" (*Poenitemini*). The 1983 revision of the Code of Canon Law incorporated the changes made by Pope Paul. Not long after that, the U.S. bishops applied the canonical requirements to the practice of public penance in our country.

To sum up those requirements, Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting as explained by the U.S. bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal.

Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

Exemptions from the Lenten Fast

Besides those outside the age limits, those of unsound mind, the sick, the frail, pregnant or nursing women according to need for meat or nourishment, manual laborers according to need, guests at a meal who cannot excuse themselves without giving great offense of causing enmity and other situations of moral or physical impossibility to observe the penitential discipline.

May our hearts be transformed so that the treasure of divine goodness overflows in our words and actions.

Stroke Prevention and Recovery

Last week, we focused on stroke awareness and how to recognize the signs of someone experiencing a stroke. We know that strokes are a leading cause of disability and death worldwide, but many strokes can be prevented, and effective recovery is possible through appropriate rehabilitation.

Stroke Prevention - Preventing a stroke involves managing risk factors through lifestyle changes and medical interventions. High blood pressure is a significant risk factor; maintaining it within a healthy range is crucial. Regular physical activity, such as brisk walking, swimming, or yard work, can improve health and reduce stroke risk. Limiting alcohol intake and quitting smoking are also essential, as smoking increases the likelihood of stroke.

Adopting a Mediterranean-style diet that has powerful nutrients found in simple foods, has been shown to reduce stroke risk. This type of eating has benefits such as reducing coronary artery disease and decreasing the risk of some cancers. The Mediterranean diet includes fresh vegetables and fruits, legumes, and healthy fats. A balanced diet rich in fruits and vegetables, particularly colorful ones like broccoli and carrots, provides antioxidants that combat inflammation, a contributor to stroke.

Stroke Recovery - Recovery after a stroke varies based on factors such as the stroke's severity and location, the individual's motivation, and the quality of rehabilitation. The most rapid recovery typically occurs within the first three to four months, but improvements can continue well into the first and second years. Rehabilitation should start in the hospital as soon as possible after the stroke. Physical therapy focuses on improving mobility and strength, while occupational therapy helps relearn daily activities like eating, dressing, and bathing. Speech and language therapy is beneficial for those with speech production disorders, aphasia, or swallowing difficulties. Engaging in repetitive, task-specific activities enhances motor learning and functional recovery.

Emotional and behavioral changes are common after a stroke due to the brain's impact on behavior and emotions. Feelings of fear, frustration, anger, grief, sadness, anxiety, and depression may occur. Addressing these changes is vital for overall recovery, and support from healthcare professionals, caregivers, and support groups can be beneficial.

In summary, while stroke poses significant health challenges, many instances can be prevented through proactive lifestyle modifications. For those who experience a stroke, early and comprehensive rehabilitation, coupled with emotional support, can lead to meaningful recovery and an improved quality of life.

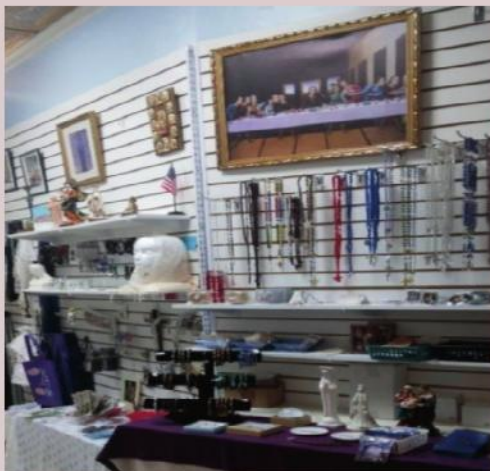
