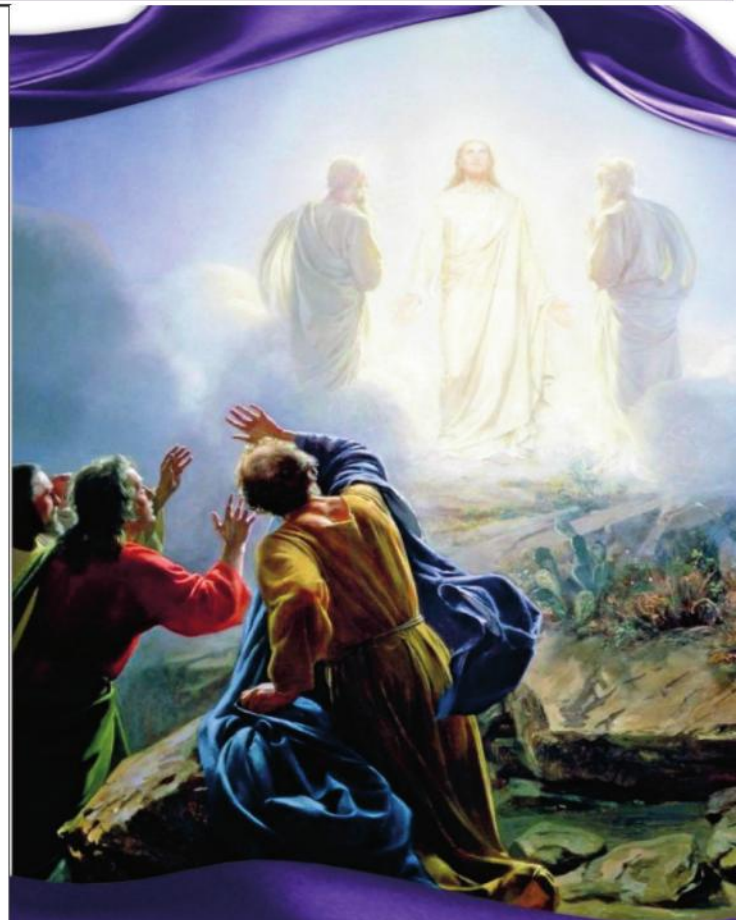

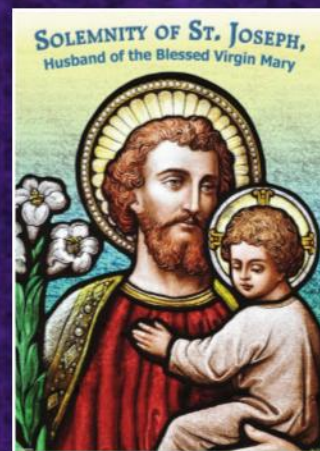

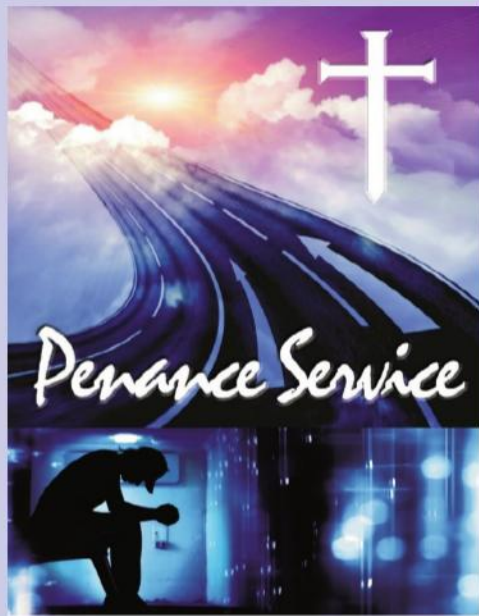

**SAINT JOSEPH, HUSBAND OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY**

**March 19**

Joseph, someone once joked, was indeed the perfect husband: the only major character in Jesus' story who never utters a word! But the Gospel recounts and the liturgy celebrates his silent witness of faith-filled deeds: "With a husband's love he cherished Mary, the Virgin Mother of God; with fatherly care he watched over Jesus" (Preface of Saint Joseph, Sacramentary). Catholic devotion, therefore, hails him as patron-protector of the universal Church. Some cultures set a festive "Saint Joseph's Table," welcoming the poor and strangers to feast with family and friends. Tradition keeps today as the anniversary of his death, which we presume was peaceful, with Jesus and Mary present. Thus, Catholics invoke Joseph as "patron of a happy death." Descended from David's house, which God finished "building" through Joseph's provision of a home for Mary and Jesus, he was, fittingly, a carpenter by trade; thus, patron of workers. Spring, nature's rebirth, begins between his feast and Annunciation (March 25), appropriately, since Joseph's silent obedience and Mary's "Let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38) usher in humanity's spiritual rebirth.

Our observance of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. At Mass on Ash Wednesday (March 5, 2025), the imposition of ashes replicates an ancient penitential practice and symbolizes our dependence upon God’s mercy and forgiveness.

During Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

The three traditional pillars of Lenten observance are **Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving**. The Church asks us to surrender ourselves to prayer and to the reading of Scripture, to fasting and to giving alms. The fasting that all do together on Fridays is but a sign of the daily Lenten discipline of individuals and households; fasting for certain period of time, fasting from certain food, but also fasting from other things and activities. Likewise, the giving of alms is some effort to share this world equally - not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents.

The key to fruitful observance of these practices is to recognize their link to baptismal renewal. We are called not just to abstain from sin during Lent, but to true conversion of our hearts and minds as followers of Christ. We recall those water in which we are baptized into Christ’s death, died to sin and-evil, and began new life in Christ.

## What is the Church's official position concerning penance and abstinence from meat during Lent?



In 1966 Pope Paul VI reorganized the Church's practice of public penance in his "Apostolic Constitution on Penance" (*Poenitemini*). The 1983 revision of the Code of Canon Law incorporated the changes made by Pope Paul. Not long after that, the U.S. bishops applied the canonical requirements to the practice of public penance in our country.

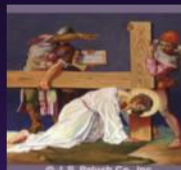
**To sum up those requirements, Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

Fasting as explained by the U.S. bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal.

Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

### Exemptions from the Lenten Fast

Besides those outside the age limits, those of unsound mind, the sick, the frail, pregnant or nursing women according to need for meat or nourishment, manual laborers according to need, guests at a meal who cannot excuse themselves without giving great offense or causing enmity and other situations of moral or physical impossibility to observe the penitential discipline.

## March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

March is National Colorectal Cancer Month—a time dedicated to raising awareness, promoting prevention, and emphasizing the importance of early detection. Colorectal cancer is one of the leading causes of cancer-related deaths, yet it is often preventable when detected early. With screening recommendations now beginning at age 45, individuals have a better chance of identifying potential problems before they advance.

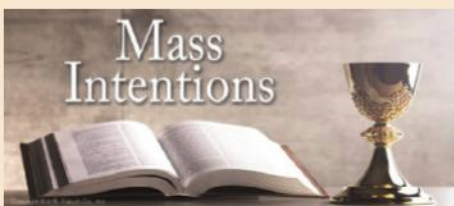
Screening plays a critical role in the fight against colorectal cancer. The American Cancer Society recommends that screening should begin at 45 for those at average risk. Early detection methods, such as colonoscopies, fecal immunochemical tests (FIT), and other stool-based tests, can help identify abnormal growths or polyps that may develop into cancer over time. By catching these abnormalities early, treatments can be more effective and less invasive, ultimately saving lives.

Recognizing the signs and symptoms of colorectal cancer is essential. Common symptoms include rectal bleeding, persistent changes in bowel habits (such as diarrhea or constipation), abdominal discomfort, and unexplained weight loss. It is important to note that these symptoms can also be associated with other, less serious conditions. However, any persistent change should prompt a consultation with a healthcare provider to rule out serious issues.

Several risk factors contribute to the development of colorectal cancer. Age is a significant factor, which is why the new screening guidelines starting at 45 are so crucial. A family history of colorectal cancer or polyps, personal history of inflammatory bowel disease, and genetic predispositions further elevate risk.
