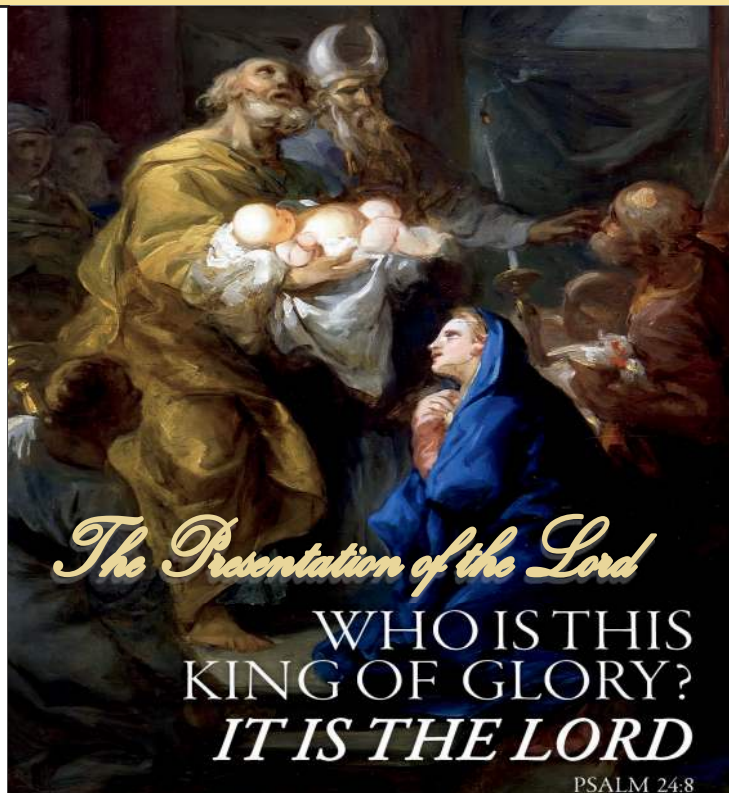

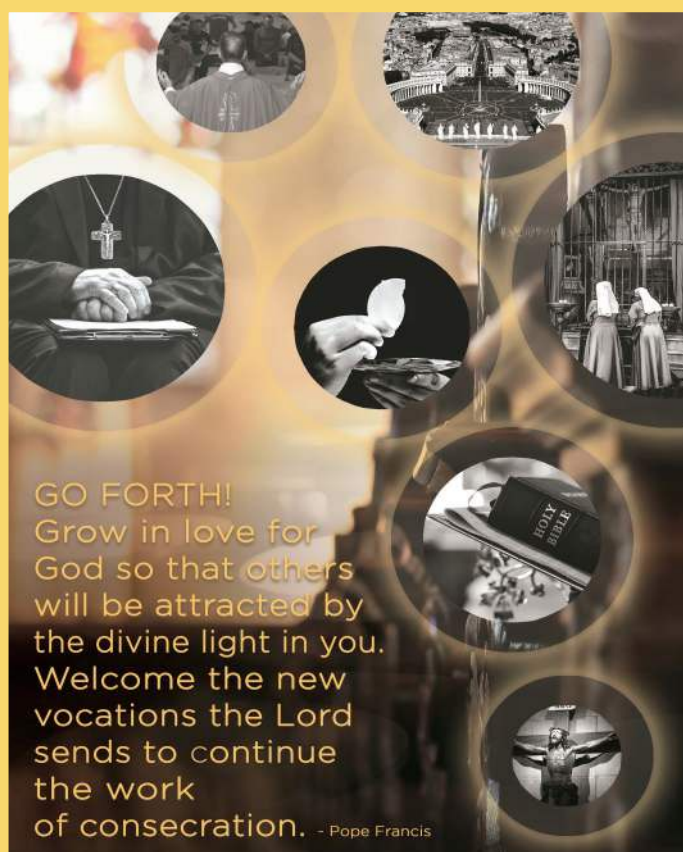

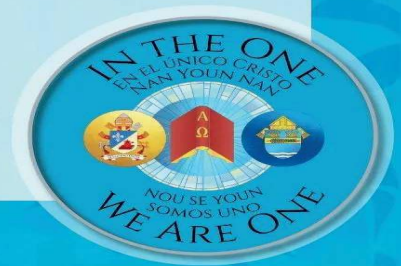

BEGINS FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 13

Our parish Bible Study begins on **February 13, 2026**. We'll be studying **The Passion and Resurrection Narratives of Jesus**, as found in all four Gospels. These accounts of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection form the basis of our Christian faith in Jesus as Savior and our hope of life eternal and personal resurrection. And, of course, these Gospel accounts are the basis of our central liturgy – The Mass. Studying the Passion and Resurrection accounts can be an excellent way to prepare ourselves for Good Friday and Easter Sunday this year. So we hope you'll join us. We meet in the Chapel on Friday mornings, from 10 – 11:30 a.m. The study will last 5 or 6 weeks, and the cost is \$20, which includes the cost of the course book you'll receive on the first day of class.

Let Your Light Shine

In the Gospel reading for today, Jesus, after seeing His crowd of followers, sits down and decides to teach them. Something He saw in the people propelled Jesus to take the time to sit down on the side of a mountain and teach what we would come to know as the Sermon on the Mount. In part of this teaching, Jesus leads the people through a series of statements highlighting the blessings of divine happiness. One of these blessings reveals how deeply Jesus cares about and understands the nature of our human hearts. He desires our holiness so that we might share in the Father's Kingdom with Him. According to Matthew, Jesus says, "Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God."

It is an act of humility to consider the cleanliness of our hearts. But like a smudged window, darkened gradually by grime, our hearts can and do become sullied by sin. This shadowing of heart space can happen subtly, almost imperceptibly. And just as it's hard to see the view through a grime-covered window, it is hard to recognize God at work in our lives when the view from our hearts has become blocked. The light simply struggles to filter in.

In today's first reading, the prophet Zephaniah urges the people to seek God. He speaks of those who see the Lord, a people "humble and lowly," a remnant chosen by God who "shall do no wrong and speak no lies; nor shall there be found in their mouths a deceitful tongue". These, the remnant, are people of a clean heart.

This level of humility is challenging, but today Psalm 146 also assures us the Lord is working for the good of the lowly, for our good, and will keep faith forever. We need not be afraid to consider the state of hearts—the Lord is with us, and in Him we can (and should) take refuge. Paul, too, reminds us in his letter to the people of Corinth that the chosen are called not through any merits of their own, but to fulfill God's mission. Imagine our hearts as magnificent stained glass adorning a cathedral. The more we allow the light to shine through them, the more God's glory is illuminated.

Today, let us make every effort to tend to our whole hearts so that as we seek God, we might also see Him. Just as the simple attention to the task of cleaning a window can make it shine and sparkle, so too that type of attention applied to the care of our own hearts will allow God's light to move through freely. And suddenly the view becomes very clear.

Candle-Mass

Candles are often-undervalued. Candlelight is warm, cozy, organic, relaxing, quieting. Beeswax candles smell wonderful and are good for your environment (my Scandinavian side values the tradition of "hygge," in which candles are a must). In Danish, candles are called "levende lys", which literally means "living light." There is something mystical about candlelight, its deep naturalness, the continuity throughout time, the connection to bees.

What does any of this have to do with today's feast? On this day, candles are a prominent feature in the liturgy – lit candles may be carried in procession and candles are blessed on this day because lit candles are used in the Church to symbolize Christ, the true Light who came into the world for all. Today is the day that the Light of the World enters His Temple anew, at last.

In complete humility and obedience to the Law, Joseph and Mary come to the Temple after 40 days to offer the required sacrifice for their firstborn son. As they enter, they are fulfilling the prophecy of Malachi: "And suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek."

The Chosen People had been promised a Messiah, and the identity of the whole Jewish nation was a people who awaited his coming, to set them free from Roman rulers and restore Israel as an eternal, peaceful kingdom. Many expected a warrior who would defeat Israel's enemies and restore the glory of their nation, as King David's descendent.

It would require a very deep spirituality to look upon this little infant being carried into the Temple by his impoverished parents and see not only the Messiah, but the Light OF THE WORLD – a light for the Gentiles as well as the Jews. It is only the aged Simeon and Anna who recognize this seemingly ordinary child as the Messiah, the very King of Glory, for whom they had patiently waited in prayer for so long.

In Simeon, the Old and New Testaments meet: as he sees the One who will proclaim that He Himself is the New Temple carried into the old temple, the aged man of the Old Covenant becomes a Christian, and Christianity's first prophet and theologian, as he proclaims, "my eyes have seen your salvation.... a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

In the Church, the great paschal candle represents Christ, the "true light", a lit candle in the sanctuary indicates that Christ is present in the tabernacle, candles are required at every Mass, at funerals and baptisms. We light them to honor God, to symbolize our sacrifice and our prayer, and to remind us that Christ is our light.

We are not a people of darkness, but of LIGHT! Today, have some candles blessed, light some candles in your home and wherever you pray, and remember that God's work of creation began with the command, "Let there be light!" - *By Kathryn Mulderink*

Saint of the Week

SAINT AGATHA (died 251)
February 5

“Of noble birth and great beauty,” so the ancient accounts describe Saint Agatha, martyred during an early persecution for refusing a powerful Roman’s offer of marriage, since she had consecrated her virginity to Christ. An early preacher, Saint Methodius, reflects instead on her name, noting that, in Greek, Agatha means “good,” goodness being something we can all strive for, nobly born or common, blessed with beauty—or not! So brutal were the tortures that violated her youthful innocence, Agatha, like Agnes and several other women martyrs, was honored from time immemorial by having her name inscribed in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I). Long invoked as protector against earthquakes—Mount Etna erupted as she was being tortured—recent attention has focused on the particularly cruel torture decreed for Agatha, the cutting off of her breasts. This has inspired cancer survivors to promote Saint Agatha as patron and intercessor for women courageously facing breast cancer, for their families and the multitude of supporters who participate in fund-raising marches and races, and, of course, for the dedicated researchers who seek a cure. —Peter Scagnelli

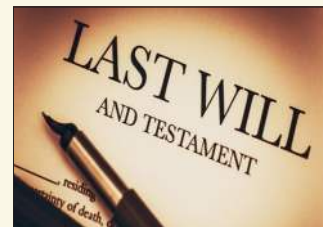
