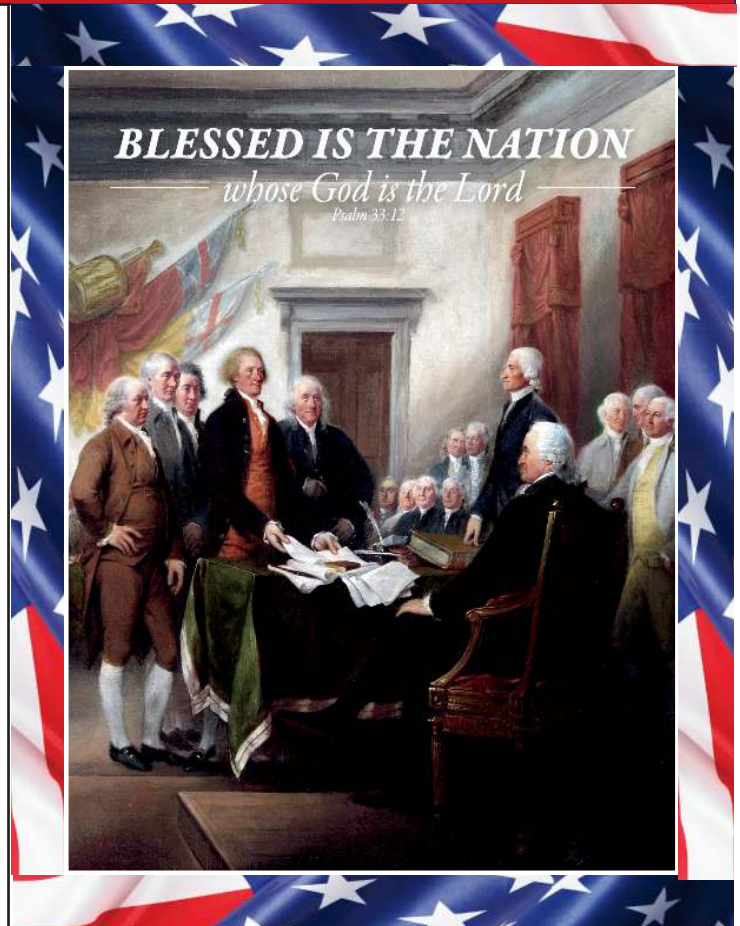

the wounds of our land be healed.*

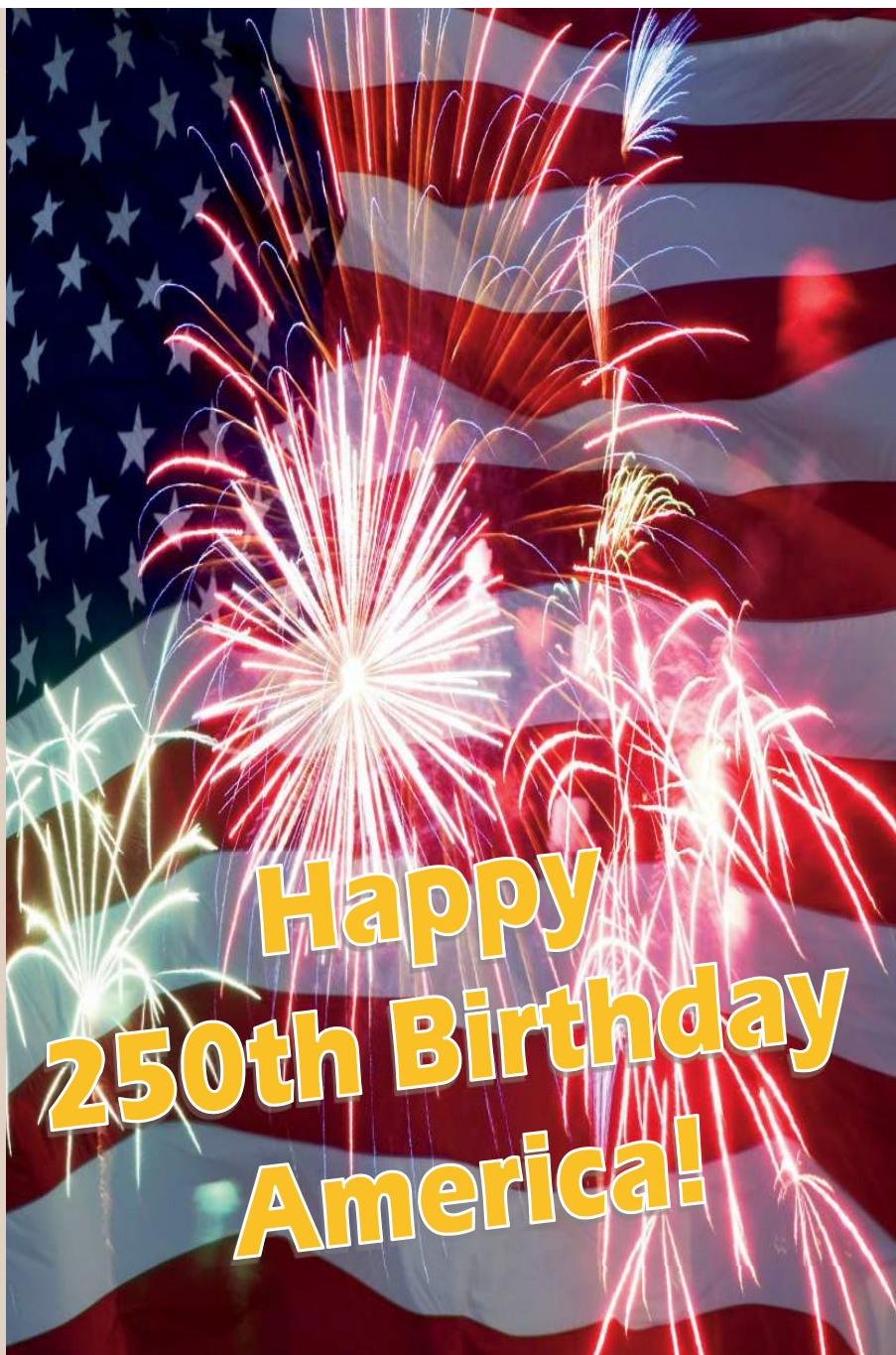

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Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles Key to the City

When an important person visits a city, sometimes the mayor presents him with the key to the city as a sign of welcome; or sometimes a key is given to a citizen who has provided exemplary service to the community. In today's Gospel, Jesus gives Simon the keys to the kingdom of heaven and gives him a new name, Peter. This is more than a symbolic honor bestowed by a mayor. Jesus is giving him both a blessing and a responsibility.

The blessing is that Peter recognized Jesus as the Son of God. It was a blessing because Peter did so, not by his own intelligence or the help of other disciples, but with faith, a gift from God the Father. Even today, people are blessed with this kind of faith. An atheist who has heard of Jesus but considers him just another holy man can receive faith and recognize Jesus as the Son of God. A person who withdraws from others and cares only for themselves can find the faith to see Jesus in those around them. A sick person can see that Jesus is with them in their suffering and begin to have hope. The faith that sees Jesus in others is the rock upon which Jesus builds his Church. It is also the "crown of righteousness" that St. Paul says belongs to all who long to see Jesus (2 Timothy 4:18).

Responsibility comes in binding and losing. One meaning of this is the power Jesus gives his Church to forgive sins. Jesus forgave many sinners, sometimes even before they asked. He knew they desired forgiveness in their hearts, even though they may not have dared to ask for it. He even forgave those who crucified him (Luke 23:34). Those who follow Jesus have the same obligation to forgive others. If we forgive those who hurt us, they may come to see God's love in us and know that God will forgive them too. On the other hand, if we refuse to forgive, we could push someone away from seeking God's forgiveness. That doesn't mean we are responsible for how others react to us. But why pass up the opportunity to show God's love by forgiving someone? All Christians pray in the Lord's Prayer that we may be forgiven as we forgive others. Let us use the keys of the kingdom to open the doors of God's love.

Saint of the Week

SAINT JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784)

July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan padre who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Blessed Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development.

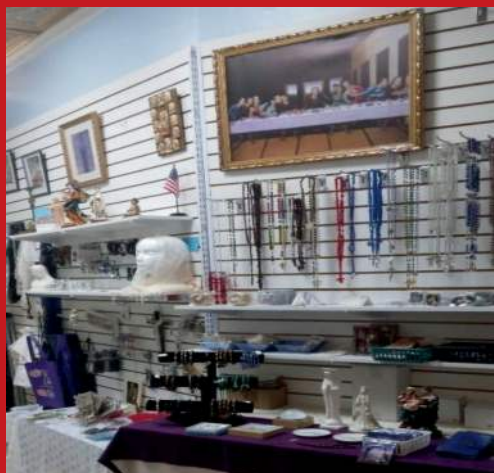
